INTRODUCTION

National Institute of Homoeopathy was established on 10th December, 1975 in Kolkata as an Autonomous Institute under the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India. It is registered under the West Bengal Societies Registration Act XXVI of 1961 with Registration No. S/L7640 of 1976-77. It Started functioning in a rented building at 118, Raja Ram Mohan Roy Sarani, Kolkata-700009 (Marwari Hospital Building) located at Amherst Street, Kolkata. On 16th August 1986, it was shifted to its present sprawling location at Block-GE, Sector-III, Salt Lake, Kolkata-700106.

Ministry of Ayush was formed on 9th November 2014 to ensure the optimal development and propagation of Ayush systems of health care in the country and since then National Institute of Homoeopathy, Kolkata is functioning under the Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India.

The Main Campus of the Institute is located in its sprawling campus in the heart of the Salt Lake City at Block-GE, Sector-III, Salt Lake, Kolkata-700106; surrounded by some of the prominent land marks viz. CRPF Campus, Calcutta Heart Clinic, Sushrut Eye Hospital, GD-Market, 12 No. Water Tank, NICCO Park, Custom Quarters, etc. The campus spreads over a land of 16 acres (Administrative cum Academic Building) having G+7 storied new Academic cum Library Building, 250 beded attached Homoeopathic Hospital, separate Hostel for undergraduate Boys' and Girls' students and Interns, one big Auditorium with 500 seating capacity and 04 nos. of quarters for the Resident Medical Officers, Football, Vollyball & Basketball Ground and Gymnasium are situated in the main campus.

The residential campus of the Institute is located at stone's throw (1 KM) distance from the main campus at JC-Block, Sector-III, Salt Lake, Kolkata-700 106 spreading over a land of 10 acres. Separate Gents and Ladies Hostel for Post-Graduate Students, International Students Hostel with all modern facilities for accommodating foreign students, 23 Nos. of Staff Quarters, and one Guest House are located in this campus. Salt Lake Stadium, AMRI Hospital, Bidhannagar Police Commissoner's Office KB-KC Block, Bidhannagar South Police Station, All India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health, S.N. Bose National Centre for Basic Sciences are some of the prominent land marks nearby the residential campus.

Herbal Garden stretched over a land area about of 25 acres at Kalyani (60 KM. from Kolkata) is maintained by the Institute, envisaged for acclimatizing exotic species of plants, and to build a repository of authentic specimens of medicinal plants for use by students and researchers.

That apart the construction of the upcoming "National Institute of Homoeopathy, Kolkata Extended Campus" on 10 acres of land at Sector - VIII, Narela, New Delhi is in full swing and expected to be operational in near future. It will have a 100-bed Referral Hospital for facilitating clinical research. The patient care will be provided mainly through Homoeopathy at secondary and tertiary level.

The vision of this Institute is to aspire to be India's most energetic and responsive organisation, offering unparallel educational opportunities in Homoeopathy for learner community seeking the highest quality undergraduate, postgraduate, and continuing personal or professional enrichment in higher education and selected professions that will lead to formation of scholarly community serving the nation by advancing, sharing and applying knowledge, and by facilitating the development of thoughtful, creative, adaptable, contributing and humane citizens.

MANAGEMENT

The Governing Body is the apex body of the Institute. Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India monitors the day-to-day functioning of the Institute, on behalf of the Governing Body. The Governing body appoints a Standing Finance Committee (SFC), which scrutinizes the proposal of the Institute involving the financial matters. There is a secretariat setup in the Department of Ayush to render effective administrative support to the Governing Body and SFC in managing the affairs of the Institute. The Director is the Chief Executive of the Institute.


ORGANISATIONAL SET UP

2. ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

The Institute is allowed by the Central Council of Homoeopathy to conduct 5 ½ years BHMS Degree course in Homoeopathy viz., Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery; and from 1998-99 to conduct 3 years M.D.(Homoeopathy) courses. The Institute was formerly affiliated to the University of Calcutta and from BHMS 16th Batch (session 2004-05) onwards the Institute is affiliated to The West Bengal University of

Health Sciences, Kolkata. At present 116 UG seats and 45 PG seats are available in NIH, Kolkata.

2.1 UNDERGRADUATE COURSES

Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) course of $5\frac{1}{2}$ years duration (including one-year compulsory rotatory internship) was started in December 1987. Students must qualify the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET-20) conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education. Presently 32^{nd} batch is in role.

For the academic session 2020-21, total 116 seats were available for admission to the BHMS Course, out of which 105 students have taken admission.

2.2 POSTGRADUATE COURSES

3 years duration M.D.(Homoeopathy) course was started in the academic year 1998-99. In this academic year six subjects viz. Organon of Medicine, Materia Medica, Repertory, Homoeopathic Pharmacy, Practice of Medicine and Paediatrics were available. Currently 22nd batch has already been enrolled through All India Ayush Postgraduate Entrance Test (AIAPGET), Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India. The courses are as per the curriculum prescribed by Central Council of Homoeopathy (CCH)/National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH). Postgraduate seats have been increased from 36 to 45 considering EWS category from 2020-21.

Subject wise distribution of seats in MD(Hom.) course

Out of total 45 seats, 2 seats are reserved for sponsored candidates of BIMSTEC countries joining through Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) and 6 seats are earmarked for Central Govt. nominees.

At present, 22nd batch has taken admission in October 2020, through All India Ayush Postgraduate Entrance Test (AIAPGET), Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India. 19th batch of PGTs completed their course curriculum in this academic year. 20th batch PGTs are preparing their dissertation work. 21st batch PGTs is appearing M.D.(Homoeopathy) Part-I Annual Examination 2021.

3. DEPARTMENT OF ACTIVITIES

There are thirteen Academic Departments apart from the Library & Information Services Division.

3.1 DEPARTMENT OF ANATOMY

In the Department of Anatomy there are sufficient numbers of charts, models, bone sets, skeletons, mounted specimens (viscera's dissected regions and parts) available to conduct both lectures as well as demonstration classes for the students, Sufficient numbers of dead bodies (dissected and un-dissected) are preserved in the department, A good number of Histological slides, projection slides, overhead project sheets, 3D charts, laminated pictures, Cd's CPR's are available in the department.

Teaching aids like LCD, LCD Monitor, Laptop & Desktop, Overhead Projector, 35mm Slide Projector, Handy Cam, Camera, sufficient number of Microscopes, etc are available in the department. Adequate numbers of test as well as reference books on Anatomy and on other subjects required for day-to-day teaching programs are also available in the department.

The numbers of staff (both teaching and non-teaching) available in the department are : one full time Reader, one full time Group D staff and one part time Group D staff.

Besides taking classes for the undergraduate, one faculty member of the department also delivers lectures periodically at Re-Orientation Training Programme in the subject Anatomy as well as at MCH and CME Programme as Resource Persons / Exparts. The faculty member guides the Interns for preparation of their project work and case recording as well as attending seminars and symposia regularly.

3.2 DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOLOGY & BIO-CHEMISTRY

The Department is located on the 4th floor of the new Academic cum Library Building. It has one of the biggest spaces available in any Physiology department among Homoeopathic Institutes in the India. It has one Physiology Practical Laboratory, one Biochemistry Practical Laboratory, one Departmental Library, one Demonstration Room, one Museum, one room for HOD and one room for Lecturer. The laboratories and equipped with modern and upgraded infrastructure.

The departmental library has adequate collection of books required for day-to-day teaching as well as reference work.

The department displayed 40 nos. of different charts, and is having different CDs and animation software and PDF format of many books for the academic interest of the students, teachers and visitors, which will leave the good impression on their mind.

The Department is staffed with one Reader Dr. A. K. Chowdhury, one Lecturer Dr. Shishir Kumar Singh and supported by one Laboratory Attendant.

Regular and intensive theory and practical classes for students are held. Regular interactive tutorials also help to enrich the students' knowledge. All the classes, both theory and practical are guided by the C.C.H./N.C.H. regulation and in accordance with the curriculum prescribed by the University.

The syllabus of the Physiology and Biochemistry are made into PowerPoint presentation for the students to understand the subject well. The syllabus of the Physiology and Biochemistry are explained through the video also with a view to having best understanding of each physiological phenomenon through clear visual understandings. The department with sufficient microscopes, instruments, books, specimens and teaching aids is being considered as one of the best Physiology Department among the Homoeopathic colleges in India.

Apart from theoretical and practical training in the subject of Physiology periodical assessment tests and tutorials are conducted to equip the students for their 1st BHMS examination under The West Bengal University of Health Sciences. The efforts are reflected in the result of university examinations. The faculty members are attending OPD on regular basis and admitting patients in the IPD, as well as sharing a number of additional responsibilities. The faculty members also guide the Interns for preparation of their Project Work and Case Recording.

3.3 DEPARTMENT OF ORGANON OF MEDICINE, CHRONIC DISEASES, HOMOEOPATHIC PHILOSOPHY AND PSYCHOLOGY

This Department is involved with postgraduate training of Homoeopathic Philosophy [M.D. (Homoeopathy)] and undergraduate teaching of Organon of Medicine [B.H.M.S.] and is affiliated to The West Bengal University of Health Sciences. The syllabus is according to CCH and West Bengal University of Health Sciences.

The department trains the undergraduate students through theory and clinical classes with the use of audio visual aids. Due to pandemic situation classes were held through blended mode, both online and offline classes were held according to situations. Besides, the interns performed their assignments under faculties of the department and also participated in case discussions during their internship in the department.

The PGTs get the opportunity of patient care, clinical experience and training both in Out Patients' Department (OPD) and in the In Patients' Department (IPD). They have to prepare assignments and perform regular seminars in the department. They also perform case presentation and discussion in journal club under guidance of departmental teachers. The postgraduate trainees have to present a certain number of seminars for faculty members and postgraduate trainees of the Institute. They are involved in teaching undergraduate students under the guidance of faculties so that they earn teaching experiences during course as advised by CCH/NCH. The PGTs also participated in various camps like Arogya Mela, Ganga Sagar Camp, free distribution of Homoeopathic medicines as preventive measure against Covid-19 etc.

In the postgraduate section there were four batches of students (19th batch – 9 Students; 20th batch – 9 Students; 21st batch – 9 Students; 22nd batch-11 students. Total = 38students). All 9 (Nine) postgraduate trainees of 19th batch successfully completed the course.

8 (Eight) postgraduate trainees of the department were selected for interview after written test for the post of General Duty Medical Officer by UPSC (the interview is awaited). One postgraduate student has been selected as Junior Research Fellow under CCRH and two postgraduate students of the department have been selected as faculty in two private Homoeopathic colleges.

The departmental faculties and postgraduate students published and presented papers during this period (2020–21). The faculty members participated in various administrative works of institute as well as acted as examiners, paper setters and moderators of various universities and National Testing Agency. All the faculties participated in World Homoeopathic Day organized by CCRH on 10th April 2020. They also attended training programme on preventive measures for Covid -19 organised by NIH on Cisco Webex. During the period of Covid-19 lockdown as per instructions of the Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India faculties participated in free Homoeopathic consultation to patients through CSC Telemedicine online portal.

Dr. Syed Afsar Ali, Lecturer, is Editor of the "Bulletin of National Institute of Homoeopathy". He is serving as APIO of RTI Section. He published two articles in Journal of Homoeopathy. He delivered lectures on Sanjivani App for sensitizing all the faculties of Homoeopathic Medical Colleges of West Bengal and also delivered lectures on Adverse Drug Reaction vs. Aggravation and Idiosyncrasy in Homoeopathy to all the faculties and homoeopathic medical officers of West Bengal. He also participated in Covid-19 Medical Camps held by NIH at New Town, Kolkata for distribution of Homoeopathic Medicine 'Arsenic Alb 30'

Dr. Gobind Narayan Gupta, Lecturer, participated in CPR Training Programme organised by NIH on Cisco Webex. He also published two articles in Journal of Homoeopathy. He is also serving as Assistant Editor of the Journal and as Assistant Academic In-charge.

Dr. Indrani Chakrabarti, Lecturer, completed a Postgraduate Executive Long Duration Programme (LDP) of one year in Leadership from Indian Institute of Management, Calcutta titled 'Transitioning into Leadership: A Programme for Women Executives ' as the topper of her batch (TLPWE03). She participated in the online training programmes of AYUSH Department for understanding and treating Covid 19.

Dr. Subhas Singh, faculty of the department has been appointed as Director of the Institute and is holding lien on his previous post of Reader.

The department has a well maintained museum and an archive of History of Medicine, both are being updated regularly.

3.4 DEPARTMENT OF MATERIA MEDICA & HOMOEOPATHIC THERAPEUTICS

The department conducts theoretical, clinical and tutorial classes both in Undergraduate and Postgraduate level. The department participates in weekly seminars, clinical and group discussions, workshops organized in the Institute. 19^{th} Batch PGTs have successfully completed their M.D.(Hom.) examination. Eleven seats are filled in Materia Medica Department for 22^{nd} batch PGTs. The students are taught to be self-relianced under the constant guidance of the teachers.

The department organized different lecture programmes, discussions & seminars in which the PG students and the faculty members participated and had discussions.

Almost all the PGTs of this department who have completed their M.D. (Hom.) from NIH, Kolkata are well settled in different positions in the Government jobs either in State Govt. or in Central Govt.

The departmental teachers contributed literary works, delivered lectures as resource person for different CME programmes conducted by CCRH and different Govt. colleges. Two teachers got enrolled in PhD. One teacher awarded with Ph.D. in Homoeopathy. All teachers of the department participated and presented papers in different webinars from time to time in COVID-19 pandemic situations. All departmental teachers acted as resource person for Training of Teachers from Govt. of Odisha Homoeopathic Medical Colleges carried out in NIH Kolkata.

Many faculties also acted as external examiners for PG students of different Homoeopathy colleges in India.

The department faculties were involved in different committees of different awareness programmes of Ministry of Ayush.



3.5 DEPARTMENT OF CASE TAKING AND REPERTORISATION

The Department of Case Taking and Repertory is situated in the 1st Floor of the New Academic-cum-Library Building since 2014 with well-equipped Computer Lab and a PG classroom.

The department imparts teaching of the subject Case Taking and Repertory to B.H.M.S. and M.D.(Hom.) Repertory students. In undergraduate level, the subject is being taught in the 3rd & 4th B.H.M.S. Presently 28th and 29th batch undergraduate students are pursuing their study in the subject. There are 11 seats available for PG in the subject of Repertory. A total 28 numbers of postgraduate trainees from 20th, 21st and 22nd batch, are pursuing their studies in the subject of Repertory at present. The teaching of the subject aims at providing knowledge in Case Taking, analysis of different aspects of cases and utility of various repertories in different types of cases. Apart from theoretical and bedside practical training in the subject of Repertory, periodical assessment tests and tutorials are conducted to equip the students for their Final BHMS examination under The West Bengal University of Health Sciences. Regular departmental seminars, clinical discussion, journal club, case presentation and group discussion are carried out in the department for Postgraduate Trainees. Repertory Department is having repertory software for analysis and synthesis of the cases. Electronic gadgets are available in the department for smooth teaching of the students.

3.6 DEPARTMENT OF HOMOEOPATHIC PHARMACY

The department imparts teaching to both BHMS as well as M.D (Hom) Homoeopathic Pharmacy students. They are exposed to different methods of preparing homoeopathic medicines and method of their standardization as per the standard Pharmacopoeia. Apart from theoretical and practical training in the subject of Homoeopathic Pharmacy, periodical assessment tests and tutorials are conducted to equip the students for their 1st BHMS examination under The West Bengal University of Health Sciences.

The Pharmacy Department has been engaged in online theory and practical classes of UG students (31st batch) from 01.04.2020 to 03.01.2021 and then offline classes started from 04.01.2021 to 31.03.2021 (both theory and practical) due to COVID-19 Pandemic situation.

The laboratory is well equipped with modern pharmaceutical instruments & apparatuses like distillation plant, hot air oven, water bath, and microscope, infrared moisture balance apart from other common instruments. The laboratory also contains 40 herbarium sheets with wooden frame, 147 herb specimen (dry), 30 herb specimens preserved in FAA solution, 10 mineral specimens and 7 animal specimens and 10 botanical slides.

Department is also having 30 nos. of charts on Homoeopathic Pharmacy & also enough chemicals for conducting practical classes. Departmental Library is having books in the subjects like HPI along with other reference books on medicinal plants and CD's on pharmacy. Department has a small medicinal plants garden in the institute campus. The students of 31st batch were taken to HAPCO Manufacturing Unit at Titagarh (W.B) on 23.03.2021.

The result of the University examination of 30^{th} batch supplementary BHMS students is given below and the 1^{st} BHMS exam of 31^{st} batch regular students has been postponed due to COVID-19 pandemic situation.

The department conducts PG course in Homoeopathic Pharmacy i.e., M.D. (Hom.) with four admissions in each academic year (In previous year the number of admission was three but from this year it has been extended to four). There is a separate Postgraduate Laboratory where the PG trainees can do their dissertation/research work/practical /departmental seminar and it accommodates a departmental journal club. However this year the PG students took part in departmental seminar online every Tuesday from 23.06.2020 to 05.01.2021 and then the offline departmental seminar was conducted till 31.03.2021. The PG students took part in Journal Club presentation every Thursday online from 25.6.2020 to 07.01.2021 and then in offline mode from 14.01.2021 to 31.03.2021. This laboratory has electric potentiser, electric triturator, spectroscope, TLC apparatus, colorimeter apparatus, digital balance, digital pH meter along with glass wares and chemicals.

Currently there are three Postgraduate batches in roll (20th, 21st and 22nd). Three PGT from 19thth batch(session 2017 to 2020) have passed MD (Hom) Part II in March 2021. Three students of 20th batch (session 2018-21) have passed the MD (Hom) Part I examination in September 2020.

The senior batch PG students(19th Batch) have taken training on Industrial Pharmacy at Hahnemann Publishing Company (HAPCO) at Titagarh from 6.10.2020 to 9.10.2020.

Prof Dr Dilip Panakkada acted as member, Expert Committee of Homoeopathy constituted by Ministry of Ayush. Govt. of India. He also functions as Member Board of Studies, UG and PG in the subject Homoeopathic Pharmacy at West Bengal University of Health Sciences.

Dr. Raja Manoharan has prepared a project along with Dr. Tridib Sarkar, for establishing Nursery in Kalyani Herbal Garden, which was sanctioned by the National Medicinal Plant Board (NMPB).

Dr.Raja Manoharan has prepared the revised project proposal regarding **"Establishment of Manufacturing Unit at Kalyani Campus of NIH"** as per the guidelines of the Governing Body of NIH and submitted it to the Director Office for onward submission to the Ministry of Ayush.

Dr. Raja Manoharan was deputed at the ESI hospital, Ayanavarm, Chennai to provide Homoeopathic treatment as an adjuvant therapy for COVID patients from 18.08.20 to 15.11.20.

Dr.Raja Manoharan has conducted the following COVID-19 projects: As a Principal investigator:

- An Evaluation on Effectiveness of Homoeopathic Intervention as an Add-On Therapy in the Management of Covid-19 Infection an Open Labelled Prospective Single Arm Observational Clinical Trials funded by NIH (Budget of Rs.2,18,000).
- A Research Study proposal on a Survey on the Effectiveness of Arsenicum album as a Prophylactic Medicine for COVID-19 among the residence of Dharavi, Mumbai, funded by NIH (Budget of Rs.77,500).



3.7 DEPARTMENT OF PRACTICE OF MEDICINE & PAEDIATRICS

The Department of Practice of Medicine deals with the undergraduate [B.H.M.S.] and postgraduate [M.D. (Homoeopathy)] curriculums under affiliation to The West Bengal University of Health Sciences. The syllabuses of curriculums are as per the CCH and the WBUHS. Due to the unforeseen COVID-19 scenario the theory and clinical classes were conducted both through off-line and online modes. Training of the students of UG and PG through patient care in OPD and IPD, supervising the interns for their compulsory rotatory internship and 'Assignment' projects as well as knowledge sharing through post-graduate seminars were regular departmental activities. Exclusive departmental seminars, journal club and clinical case presentations/ discussions (for the postgraduate course) have been initiated since March, 2020 and are continued in spite of a temporary interference of lockdown. Training for the PG students under the direct supervision of the faculties about how to take classes (both theory and clinical) for the



94% students of sent up batch (27^{th} batch) of BHMS curriculum of NIH have succeeded in Practice of Medicine in Final BHMS Examination under the WBUHS and one student got the honors marks.

PGTs of 20th batch successfully passed the M.D. (Homoeopathy)-Part I examination. All the postgraduate trainees of 19th Batch PTs completed their course successfully and obtained the M.D. (Homoeopathy) degree. The new batch (22nd) with four PGTs joined in January, 2021. While two PGTs of this batch successfully qualified the written test of UPSC, one PGT of 21st batch joined the service of Medical Officer under the Govt. of UP. During 2020-21 this Department has only two full time faculties and two guest physicians. Inter-departmental collaboration for teaching and training was continued during this period. During this period (2020–21) departmental faculties and postgraduate students published papers in international peer-reviewed journals and presented papers in various seminars. Dr. Subhash Chaudhary, Lecturer has been pursuing Ph.D. under The West Bengal University of Health Sciences. He acted as Associate Editor of the peer-reviewed journal of NIH - 'The Journal of Homoeopathy'. He was the In-charge of COVID-19 medical camp in New Town, Kolkata jointly organized by NIH and New Town Kolkata Development Authority (NKDA). As the Principal Investigator of research project titled, 'A Retrospective Cohort Study to find out the Effectiveness of Homoeopathic Immune Booster Arsenicum album 30 distribution in population during Pandemic COVID-19', he submitted the project report to the Ministry of Ayush. He imparted training in AHMIS and Ayush Sanjivani Mobile App for the doctors of NIH. Among many administrative responsibilities at NIH, Dr. Chaudhary acted as Nodal Officer of Ayush Grid, NIH after obtaining training from C-DAC Pune. He acted as Nodal Officer of Ayush Clinical Case Repository Portal (Homoeopathy), Open Government Data (OGD) NDASP and 'National Data Sharing and Accessibility Policy 2012'. He was entrusted for Tele Medicine - Namaste Portal, Ayush Research Portal. He received a special mention appreciation from the Ministry of Ayush for his service through Telemedicine.

Dr. Gautam Pal, Lecturer & HOD being member of Board of Studies (for both undergraduate and postgraduate curriculum) of the affiliating university "WBUHS" played important role. He also acted as paper-setter, moderator, convener & examiner of different Universities. He was an adjudicator of PG course. He was a resource person at CME organized by NIH for Teaching Faculties of Govt. Homoeopathic Medical College, Odisha. His one paper, as co-author with the departmental PGTs, has been published and another paper has been accepted in an internationally reputed peer-reviewed journal. Dr. Pal was active as member of some administrative committees of the Institute. He was awarded with the first prize in essay writing in Vigilance Awareness Week as well in Swachhta Pakhwada observed at NIH.

3.8 DEPARTMENT OF SURGERY

Activities of the Department:

The Department is located on the 1st floor of the New Academy-cum- L i b r a r y Building. The departmental library has adequate collection of books required for day-to-day study as well as reference work in relation to Surgery and Homoeopathy.

The Department displayed the sufficient number of different charts for readymade clinical knowledge of the students.

Dr. Ramkrishna Ghosh has been working as Lecturer & HOD of the Department. Some qualified specialist in concerned subject working as Guest Faculty who are engaged in both health care and teaching in the Department.

Number of Faculty Members: Full Timer: Lecturer: 01, Guest Lecturer: 04 (Oncologist: 01, ENT Surgeon: 01, Dental Surgeon: 01, Ophthalmologist: 01).

Regular and intensive theory and practical classes for students are held. Regular interactive tutorials also help to enrich the students' knowledge. All the classes, both theory and practical are guided by the CCH/NCH. regulations and in accordance with the curriculum prescribed by the University. The efforts are reflected in the result of university examinations on regular basis

Both theory and practical classes held for the 2nd & 3rd BHMS students as per schedule laid down in CCH/NCH norms in Class rooms, IPD, OPD respectively, The students, interns, PGTs are being acquainted with the basic concepts and techniques in surgical diseases in OPD and IPD. The scopes and limitations of Homoeopathy are also being taught by the concerned departmental faculty member.

The Department has 20 instruments 35 charts, 08 models etc. for demonstration to the students. Students, Interns and PGTs are being trained in the basics of General Surgery, Systemic Surgery, Eye, ENT and Dental surgery both in OPD and IPD by the concerned specialist. At the same time homoeopathic treatment is provided for the cases.

Students, Interns and PGTs are being trained in the basics of first aid to a victim/patient in collaboration with St. John Ambulance Association, West Bengal.

Apart from General and Systemic Surgery, ENT, Eye and Dental classes also organized by the Dept. of Surgery along with their respective OPD where students were attending to learn from respective specialist doctors. Theory classes of those areas also taken by the concerned specialist doctors. Along with their homoeopathic counterpart, is taught by the HOD, Surgery who himself is a postgraduate qualified homoeopathic doctor.

Since April 2015, OT is non-functional. The OT will re-open in new hospital building (2^{nd} Floor) very soon.

There is a special Oncology OPD at New hospital building. Every Tuesday it is running by a Cancer Specialist in modern medicine with other qualified Homoeopaths, PGTs and Interns. It helps the cancer patients to get free consultancy and homoeopathic medicines. At the same time the students, Interns and PGTs are gathering knowledge for their learning purposes.

3.9 DEPARTMENT OF OBSTETRICS AND GYNAECOLOGY

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology is involved in teaching of 2^{nd} 8.H.M.S students. Also PGTs have their training in this department whenever they need help for dealing with obstetrical or gynaecological cases. The department has one full-time Lecturer only as the faculty. The total hours of theory classes taken per week was 11 hrs. and clinical classes taken per week was 16 hrs. There are 6 charts, 8 specimens, 30 instruments, 3 dummy fetuses, 2 fetal skull, 6 contraceptives and 9 models available in the department. Classes of 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} B.H.M.S. were conducted as per the norm of CCH/NCH, and WBUHS. Besides the everyday teaching activity, the department also participated in the weekly seminar. Students were also presenting papers in the classes weekly. Interns were given practical training in O.P.D and I.P.D of NIH. Interns were being guided to carry out their assignment works under the Departmental Head. Postgraduate students were guided by the Head of this Department for their dissertation works. Since lock down due to COVID-19 pandemic, the online classes were being taken for the students.

3.10 DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY MEDICINE

The Department of Community Medicine is involved in teaching of 4th BHMS students as well as research methodology and bio-statistics for PG students. The Department has one museum (for practical demonstration), where different instruments, models and charts related to different subject matters of PSM (e.g. family planning, nutrition, immunization, medical entomology, public health, etc.) are preserved for practical classes. All the classes, both theory and practical, are guided by the CCH/NCH regulation and in accordance with the curriculum prescribed by the University.

The students visited different important public health places or centres as part of their field visits in accordance with the prescribed university curriculum. The students of 27th BHMS batch of NIH had their first field visit to Rural Health & Training Centre, Singur which is the field practice area of All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health. The students also visited National Institute of Cholera & Enteric Diseases under ICMR for having exposure to various research activities that have been carried out by the said organisation .

Every year from 10th January to 16th January the Homoeopathic Camp at **Gangasagar Mela** is being organized by this Department with the help of Hospital Section, NIH.

The Interns, 26th & 27th batch, were sent to Beleghata ID Hospital as well as to Bidhannagar Sub-divisional Hospital for two weeks training in management of infectious diseases and for exposure to various National Health Programmes that were being carried out through Primary Health Centre respectively on monthly rotation basis.







3.11 DEPARTMENT OF FORENSIC MEDICINE & TOXICOLOGY

The Dept. of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology is being headed by a full time Reader. Regular theoretical, practical and tutorial classes for 2^{nd} BHMS students are taken by the lone faculty. The teacher of the department is also involved in patient care and training of interns as well as PGTs' in the hospital OPD and IPD.

Regular classes (both theoretical, practical/tutorial) were taken as per schedule. For updating the knowledge of the students, internal assessment, theoretical, practical and oral examinations were conducted from time to time. Sixty eight (68) students appeared for the regular examination, and all of them, except three (who subsequently passed in the supplementary examination), successfully passed the university examination conducted by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences.

The departmental faculty contributed to literary works, presented paper in webinar during this COVID-19 pandemic situation and also participated in different awareness programmes of the Ministry of Ayush.

The departmental Museum is equipped with 30 wax models, 04 sets of dried non- articulated human bone specimens of both sexes, 25 wet specimens (different types of snakes), 136 various types of weapons, 110 poisonous specimens, 14 charts, 25 different instruments and appliances along with 150 photographs, 02 CDs and a good number of radiological plates (exposed X-ray films) - all are having medico-legal importance for demonstration purpose to the students.

3.12 DEPARTMENT OF PATHOLOGY & MICROBIOLOGY

The Department of Pathology and Microbiology of National Institute of Homoeopathy is well maintained and well equipped department for the II^{ND} BHMS students. The New Pathology and Microbiology Laboratory is now housed in 4th floor

of new academic building of NIH and has started converting its present laboratory into an updated and modern laboratory. The department is headed by one Lecturer Dr. Kumaravel V. The theory & practical classes of 30th batch were taken online and uploaded to the Youtube channel with a title "Pathology and Microbiology classes of NIH". Total 49 theory and practical classes were uploaded to the said channel. The Departmental Laboratory has good facilities for practicing independently. It is provided with individual microscope under table lamp that help students to do their work even in cloudy & rainy weather. Total 92 students of 29th batch & 30th batch were attended the regular online classes and appeared for the online class test after completion of particular topic through Google Class Room. For the departmental Library, requisition is submitted to the Central library for new books. The departmental library possesses 43 books in Pathology and Homoeopathy and some personal books of Dr. Kumaravel. V. as well.

The Pathology Museum consists of 56 nos. of malignant specimens for the students and different visitors from the different Homoeopathy colleges in India and abroad. The department displays 17 nos. of different display charts for the academic interest of the students, teachers and visitors. The bacteriological experiments like culture media, hanging drop preparation and certain serological experiments are the curricular activities of student's practical learning.

The department has one LED Monitor & one LAPTOP which help the students to learn more pathogenesis with morphological characteristics by visual images & animations. The PowerPoint presentations as well as video presentations of the syllabuses of the Pathology & Microbiology are made for the students to understand the subject well. This presentation has a huge impact to the students in understanding various aspects of diseases. The practical demonstration of macroscopic & microscopic characteristics of all topics through Dewinter capture pro 4.1 software is provided to the student for having excellence on the subject.

Every year more than 90% students pass in II BHMS in the WBUHS Examination. The research activities like photochemical studies of Homoeopathic Medicine and Anti Microbial Assay of Homoeopathy Medicine are going on along with academic activities in order to encourage the students in research in the respective field of study. The new upgraded department along with Pathology and Microbiology Laboratory with sufficient microscopes, books, specimens, and teaching aids may be considered to be the best Pathology and Microbiology Department among the Homoeopathic colleges in India.

3.13 DEPARTMENT OF PAEDIATRICS (PG)

The Department is functioning as a separate Post-Graduate department as per the regulations of CCH/NCH, New Delhi since 2009 when the MD (Hom) course in the subject Paediatrics was introduced here at NIH. The department is located at the 1st floor, new Academic Block. There are separate Lecture Hall, Departmental Library, Laboratory, Rooms for Head/In-charge and Teaching Faculty as well as PGT's. Internet and Audio-visual facilities are available in the Lecture Hall and the Laboratory.


The intake capacity for MD (Hom) in the subject is Four (04) per session. Dr Shishir Kumar Singh, Lecturer, Department of Physiology is looking after the department as In-charge (Additional charge) of the department and coordinating the

activities of the department.

The department is well equipped as per regulations of CCH/NCH, New Delhi. There is one dedicated Paediatric O.P.D. attached to the Hospital. Six (6) beds are available in the I.P.D. where patients are admitted regularly from Paediatric O.P.D. Regular Journal Club, Clinical Case Discussion, Weekly Departmental Seminar and Monthly General Seminars are conducted by the department of Paediatrics.

3.14 LIBRARY & INFORMATION SERVICES (LIS)

Library & Information Service Division was established in 1978 to act as an aid for the development of research and training in Homoeopathy. Presently it is functioning in the 3rd Floor of the G+7 storied Academy-cum-Library Building. It has world class infrastructure and facilities including electronic information system to meet the requirement of all students / researchers / faculty members of the Institute and enthusiasts from outside also.



CENTRAL LIBRARY, NIH

Objectives:

- The main objective of the Division of Library & Information Services is to organize and to make the documents available to the users.
- To develop NIH Library & Information Centre, Kolkata into National Information Centre on Homoeopathy.

Activities of the Library

The Library & Information Services division provides the information system which is taken care of by efficient library staff. At present, there are more than 22000 books and 06 subscribed journals in the library. Institute has its own website, http://www.nih.nic.in developed in the year 2002. Current Awareness Services (CAS) and Flash (Internet information on homoeopathy world) are provided and partial automation has been achieved through WINISIS software.

One archive for rare books, including some rare non-English (German, Spanish etc.) books, is available as reference work.

Selective Dissemination Service, a bi-monthly compilation of the contents of the current journals, subscribed by the Institute is published regularly. Reprography, binding, photography, A/V etc., are also provided. Five PG Departmental Libraries were set up with the help of the Central Library & Information Service Department. Presently all the Departments also have Departmental Library.

INTRODUCTION

National Institute of Homoeopathy, an Autonomous Institution under the Ministry of Ayush Govt. of India is having Undergraduate Course, post-graduate course with attented 100 bedded hospital along with Postgraduate Medical College. There is also a Research Wing for imparting Postgraduate and Under Graduate courses in Homoeopathy. There is also a separate Research Wing for research in Homoeopathy.

The Hospital is consisting of Out Patient Department (OPD) and Inpatient Department (IPD) providing Health Care services at the cost for registration fee of Rs. 5.00 per patient including medicine & nominal charges for investigations. The outpatient department is functioning from 9.00 a.m.(Registration of patients starts from 8:30 a.m.) till the last patient is served. Apart from general medicine, some specialized clinics are also in service. A huge number patients from far remote areas of West Bengal, some of them from Assam, Tripura, Manipur, Nagaland, seek treatment through Homoeopathic systems of medicine. The hospital has investigation facilities viz. Clinical Pathology, Biochemistry, Radiology, Ultra-Sonography, Lung Function Test, TMT, GI Endoscopy, Echo Cardiograph and ECG etc. The Institute has been presently providing Indoor facilities through 100 bedded hospital. 100 beds are earmarked for General Medicine Ward (Male & Female) - 50 Beds Including 8 Cabins in which 40 beds for acute patients and 10 beds for chronic patients, Surgical Ward-20 beds (Male & Female), Gyane. & Obs. - 20 beds and 06 beds in Pediatrics Ward. As this is an academic institution, patients suffering from different chronic ailment are admitted for treatment as well as for clinical training of the Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate students. The bed strength of the Hospital will soon enhanced to 250 beds in a phase wise manner in our New Hospital Building. The Health Care Services through hospital provided under following heads:-



GRAPHICAL CHART FOR DEPARTMENT WISE PATIENT AT SALT LAKE









HOSPITAL RECORD KEEPING:

A systematic data entry and record-keeping of all OPD & IPD patient's and all data related to patients, systematical preservation of data from 2008-09 to till date are completed and entered into the database. There is a separate Medical Record Keeping Division in new hospital building.

HOSPITAL KITCHEN & DIET:

At present raw materials are procured from suppliers and prescribed diet for the admitted patients are prepared by our own staff in the In- House- Kitchen of the Hospital. The Dietician looked into special requirements or recommendations for the diet of the patients.

After retirement of Dietician one contractual Dietician appointed to look into the Diet Section. The hospital kitchen has been modernized to serve for 250 bedded hospital patients.

DISPENSARY:

The prescribed medicines by attending physicians from the OPD & IPD are dispensed from the In-House Dispensary of the hospital. Emphasis is given for dispensing of standard quality of Homoeopathy medicines to the patients. Pharmacist is always keeping attention under the guidance of senior Physician from preparation to serve medicines to patients. Necessary care has been taken, so that every patient's medicine is being dispensed accurately which is prescribed by physician. Adequate stock of medicine is maintained as per the approval of Institute's own Medicine Formulary Committee.

AMBULANCE SERVICE:

The hospital also provides Ambulance Service for transportation of the patients as and when required during emergency referral service. Ambulance is available round the clock for which driver's accommodation inside the campus for service is provided.

4.3 OPERATION THEATRE:

The Hospital is having well equipped, two modern Operation Theatres with apparatus/instruments, such as pulse-oxemeter, diathermy, portable ECG, X-ray and Microscope etc. Operation techniques are demonstrated to the students for training. The Operation Theatre will be shifted to New Hospital Building very soon. New setup and modernized infrastructure is going to be ready shortly.





4.9 MEDICINAL HERB GARDEN

The herb garden at Kalyani, about 60 km away from Kolkata, was envisaged for building up of repository of authentic specimens of living herbs for research and academic purposes and acclimatization of exotic herbs in the fertile plains of gangetic alluvium in West Bengal, in order to develop import substitutes, for catering to the needs of local pharmaceutical industries as well as export oriented products. The garden, spread over about 25 acres of land has grown and maintained 100 different species of medicinal plants, including 10 exotic species. Steps have been taken to develop the infrastructure.

1.5 Kilometer of road network in the garden have been developed with excavated earth from the existing water body in the garden and sprinkler irrigation system for 8 acres of land has been developed.

Medicinal crops Alfalfa, Aloes Vera, has registered a good yield.

National Institute of Homoeopathy -

Medicinal crops Linumusitatissimum & Cuminumcyminum registered good yield demonstrating that wide range of commercial crops can be grown successfully at the garden.

One project proposal already been accepted by the National Medicinal Plant Board to cultivate, nurturing and utilizing some medicinal herbs in relation to establish Medicinal Plant's nursery for Institute.

For beautification of herbal garden one small flower garden adjacent to main entrance is well maintained. One peripheral OPD is running once in a week (Friday) in this Herb garden premises, more than 100 patients are attending for homeopathy treatment.

For the benefit of students the following plants - species were grown up and maintained during last few years.

- 1) Aloe Vera
- 2) Vinca Rosea (Nayan Tara)
- 3) Hydrocotyle Asiatica (Thankuni)
- 4) Carica Papaya (Papita)
- 5) Hygrophilia Spinosa (Kule Khara).

This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only, with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms etc. Audit observations on financial transactions, in regard to compliance with the Laws' Rules & Regulations (i.e, Propriety and Regularity aspects) and efficiency-cumperformance aspects, etc, if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/ CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. Wehaveconductedourauditinaccordancewiththeauditingstandardsgenerally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on at estbasis' evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management' as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements' We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion'

4. Based on our audit. we report that:

- i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which, to the best of our knowledge and belief, were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- ii) The Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account, dealt with in this report, have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India.
- iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Institute, as required, insofar as it appears from our examination of books.

iv. We further report that:

Comments on accounts

A) Balance Sheet

1.1 Liabilities:

1.1.1 Corpus/Capital Funds (Schedule 1):₹263.32 crore

Despite similar mention in the previous year's Audit Report, the above head was overstated by ₹105.37 crore, due to addition of advances paid to executing agencies for deposit works, by the Institute. The Earmarked Fund Grant for Capital Expenditure' (Schedule 3) was also understated by the same amount.

1.1.2 Earmarked/Endowment Fund (Schedule 3): ₹ 6.75 crore

- a) The above head was overstated by ₹ 5.78 crore, due to inclusion of balances under GPF, in the main accounts, under Schedule 3, despite similar mention in the previous year's Audit Report. The Current Assets, Loans and Advances' (Schedule II) was also overstated by the same amount.
- b) The above head was understated by ₹22.41 crore, due to non-consideration of the advance of ₹22.41 crore, paid to M/s 'MECON Ltd', by the Ministry, for undertaking the 'NIH Narela Construction Work' at New Delhi. Despite similar mention in the previous year's Audit Report, the Institute has not taken any rectificatory measures in this regard. This further led to under statement of 'Capital Work-in-Progress (CWP)', by the same amount.

1.2 Assets

1.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 8): ₹ 193.05 crore

The above head was understated by ₹ 17.26 crore, due to non-capitalization of the works of 'AMC both Civil & Electrical Works, Installation of Bronze Statue, Renovation of Class Room, Renovation of Anatomy Building etc., executed by M/s NPCCL, even though the works had been completed and put to use during the financial year 2009-10. Consequently, the 'Corpus/ Capital Fund' (Schedule 1) was understated by the same amount.

B. General

2.1 Despite mention in the previous year's Audit Report, no provision was made for retirement benefits on actuarial basis, even though this is prescribed in the Uniform Format of Accounts.

C. Giants-in-Aid

The Institute is fully funded by grants from the Government of India. During the financial year 2020-21, it received grants, amounting to ₹ 105.94 crore (Capital- Non-recurring) and ₹ 39.11 crore (GIA-Salary: ₹ 21.30 crore, GIA General: ₹ 17.56 crore, GIA-Swachhta Action Plan: ₹ 0.25 crore), from the Ministry.

Out of the total grants of ₹ 145.05 crore so available, it spent (₹ 32.72 crore (Capital: ₹ 0.68 crore and Recurring: ₹ 32.04 crore), leaving an overall unspent balance of ₹ 112.33 crore (Capital: ₹ 105.26 crore and Recurring: ₹ 7.07 crore). The unspent balance includes Advances amounting to ₹ 109.52 crore, paid to Construction Agencies.

₹105.36 crore to different construction agencies and ₹ 4.16 crore towards different payable liabilities.

D. Net Effect

The net impact of the comments given in the preceding paragraphs is that the Assets and Liabilities, of the Institute's Balance Sheet, as on 31 March 2021, were understated by ₹ 23.89 crore.


E. Management Letter

 - a. insofar as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the National Institute of Homoeopathy, Kolkata, as at 31 March 2021 and
 - b. insofar as it relates to Income and Expenditure Account of the Surplus, for the year ended on that date.

Further, the rates of depreciation and the estimated life of the fixed assets, were also not mentioned. The Institute had conducted physical verification of its Fixed Assets and Inventories, during the financial yeat 2020-21.

D Statutory Liabilities:-

The Institute was regular in payment of its Statutory Dues.

SCHEDULE 24- SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Principal activities of the Institute are to impart education, provide health care facilities and promoting research activities in Homoeopathy.

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

- (i) The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting and on going concern concept.
- (ii) Government Grants, against which sanction orders are issued within 31st March, are taken into account as income for that financial year, on accrual basis.
- (iii) The Institute's accounts reflect the utilisation of the grants received/receivable from the Government of India and other related incomes received/accrued up to 31st March, Therefore, liabilities, known and admissible, are provided for in the accounts.
- (iv) All other known incomes, if accrued within 31st March, whether received or not, are taken into account on accrual basis.
- (v) Liabilities for expenses over Rs.1000/- to the extent known, up to a cut-off date 31st May, and admissible are accounted for. Similarly, payments in advance for subsequent accounting period are accounted for as advance/pre-paid expenses.

2. FIXED ASSETS

• >>

For any expenditure incurred for creation of Capital Asset utilizing Grant received for the purpose and for purchase of other assets the Corpus/Capital Fund Account is credited by capitalizing from the Earmarked Fund for Capital Grant or any Other Grant allowing procurement of assets and GIA General Grants received (the balance available grant is utilized for revenue expenditure). When the Assets are sold/condemned or otherwise disposed off, the respective asset account is credited by the written down book value of the asset and the difference between written down value and net realized value is exhibited as profit/loss on disposal of obsolete assets and credited/debited to income and expenditure account respectively.

Assets are shown at gross value less accumulated depreciation provided in the accounts upto the end of the year.

3. **DEPRECIATION**

Depreciation on assets has been calculated on the written down value method at the prevailing rates of depreciation specified in the Income Tax Act, 1961 as amended from time to time. The depreciation has been provided in the books on additions to the assets and put to use during the year for a period of less than 180 days in the financial year is provided at 50% of the prescribed rates. The total depreciation calculated on all depreciable assets during the year, is provided for by charging the Income and Expenditure Account. An amount equal to the amount of depreciation provided on assets created out of Government Grant has been withdrawn from Capital / Corpus Fund and credited to Income & Expenditure Account as per the provisions of Accounting Standard-12. Assets costing Rs. 5,000/- or less each are fully provided.

4. FLEXI FIXED DEPOSIT

The Institute maintained current account with Flexi Fixed Deposit facility. Under this system bank transfer the available fund in excess of Rs. 2.50 lakh to a flexible fixed deposit account, earning interest. The bank automatically transfer the required money out of flexible fixed deposit account on presentation of cheque before the bank in excess of Rs. 2.50 lakh to make up the shortfall, if any, and keeping a balance of Rs. 2.50 lakh in the current account at the end of the day. The balance of flexi fixed deposit account included in the Deposit Account balance of the Institute.

5. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted in INR (Indian Rupee) at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction. No expenditure in foreign currency has been incurred by the Institute during the current and previous year.

6. <u>RETIREMENT BENEFITS</u>

No liability towards gratuity payable on death / retirement / termination of employees including leave encashment benefit is provided on actuarial basis in the accounts. All such retirement benefits are recorded on the basis of actual payment.

7. <u>SET OFF</u>

Advances to staff are set off against the corresponding liabilities by charging the relevant expenditure, to the extent linked,

8. <u>INVESTMENT</u>

The Institute has no Investment other than Term Deposits in the Nationalised Banks. As per Memorandum of Association, Rules and Regulations and Bye Laws of the Institute, the Institute's entire investments are made with Nationalised Bank in Short Term Bank Deposits.

9. INVENTORY VALUATION

Value of Medicines & Accessories has been accounted for in the books under FIFO Method.

1) Contingent Liabilities

Liability for land premium / salami of Rs. 87.17 lakh and Rs. 2.98 lakh for lease rental are contingent on the demand from the State Government.

2 Capital Commitments

- i) During the year Rs. 1395.99 lakh has been paid to NPCCL for 2nd Phase construction work at NIH, Kolkata in addition to Advance of Rs. 2329.25 lakh paid till last year. Out of the total Advance the agency certified that Rs. 1541.11 lakh has been utilised against the total cost of the project of Rs. 3708.39 lakh as per contract for the 2nd Phase development of the Institute. The Agency, as per their Fund Utilisation Certificate, has not earned any interest during the year on the fund paid to them. The Agency has yet to return the amount of interest of Rs. 2.65 lakh, earned by the agency during 2018-19. The recoverable Interest is payble to Ministry of AYUSH.
 - ii) Utilisation certificates of NPCCL is still pending for adjustement of old advacne of Rs. 715.45 lakh remain outstanding as on 31-03-2021.

The closing balances of all the funds represent bank balances. Receipts and payments of the Sub Funds, books of accounts of which are maintained separately, for the year incorporated in the General Fund Book.

- a) During the year the seperate books of accounts of Fund for Capital Expenditure has been closed and maintained with the General Fund as the PFMS system permit only one bank account for three main Grant for General, Capital and Salary. As the payment out of Government Grant is to be made through PFMS the separate books of accounts for the GIA Capital is being merged with general Fund and to be operated torn the Bank account of the General Fund operated through PFMS.
- b) The separate books of accounts for CME Programme has been closed on completion of the scheme. The unutilised fund along with interest thereon has duly been refunded to Ministry.
- c) The Contributory Provident Fund has also been closed on the retirement of the last member of the fund. The remaining balance after the payment of dues to the last member along with interest thereon has been transferred to Pension Fund Account on closing of seperate bank account for CPF.
- d) Separate Grants from the Ministry under Modified Extra Mural Research Scheme and AYUSH Grid Scheme have been received during the year and maintained with General Fund for availing PFMS sytem for payment.
- 8. The Ministry of AYUSH vide their letter No. G.25020/6/2018/NI has made it mandatory to submit the interest earned in previous year on all type of GIA to Consolidated Fund of India. The accumulated interest earned as at the year end amounts to Rs. 284.14 lakh including interest recoverable from the construction agency. Interest of Rs. 255.17 lakh (284.14-26.32-2.65) on grants received from Ministry including interest of Rs.74.84 lakh recovered during the year is to be refund to the Ministry.
