INTRODUCTION

NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF HOMOEOPATHY was established on 10th December 1975 in Kolkata, An Autonomous Institute under the Govt. of India, Ministry of AYUSH. The Institute was affiliated to the University of Calcutta up to the session 2003-04 and from 2004-05 has been affiliated to the West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata. The Institute, conducts the degree course in Homoeopathy i.e., Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery [B.H.M.S.] since 1987 and Post - Graduate course i.e. Doctor of Medicine in Homoeopathy [M.D. (Hom.)] since 1998. At present PG course is offered in six subjects viz. Organon of Medicine, Materia Medica, Repertory, Homoeopathic Pharmacy, Practice of Medicine and Paediatrics.

The Institute is functioning in its own campus measuring about 16 acres of land at Block-GE, Sector - III, Salt Lake City, Kolkata - 700 106, from August 1986 onwards. The Institute has an Academic building/Administrative block, Hospital (IPD/OPD) and Under Graduate Hostels for boys and girls. Construction of the Phase-1 of the 8-storied Academic-cum-Library building situated in the main campus at block GE is about to be completed. The 1st Phase (G+3 floors) of the new Academic-cum-Library building with all modern amenities has been completed and allotted to 7-(seven)-departments since then all classes of the respective departments are conducted in the new building. Construction of hospital extension building for extension of hospital bed strength from existing 100 to 250 beds (G+3) completed, awaiting handing/taking over for final stage of electrical works for AC which is near completion. There are two other campuses, one measuring about 10 acres (approx.) located in Block-JC, Salt Lake, Kolkata, where Residential Quarters for the staff of the Institute, International Hostel and Post Graduate Hostel are situated. Another campus measuring about 25 acres having an herbal plant garden and a peripheral OPD is located in Kalyani, Dist. Nadia, West Bengal, about 50-kms. away from the main campus.

National Institute of Homoeopathy has been declared as "Center for Traditional Medicine in South East Asian Region Countries under Delhi Declaration" by the Govt. of India.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE INSTITUTE

MANAGEMENT

The Governing Body is the apex body of the Institute. The Governing body appoints a Standing Finance Committee, which scrutinizes the proposal of the Institute involving the financial

matters. There is a secretariat setup in the department of AYUSH to render effective administrative support to the Governing Body and SFC in managing the affairs of the Institute. The Director is the Chief Executive of the Institute.

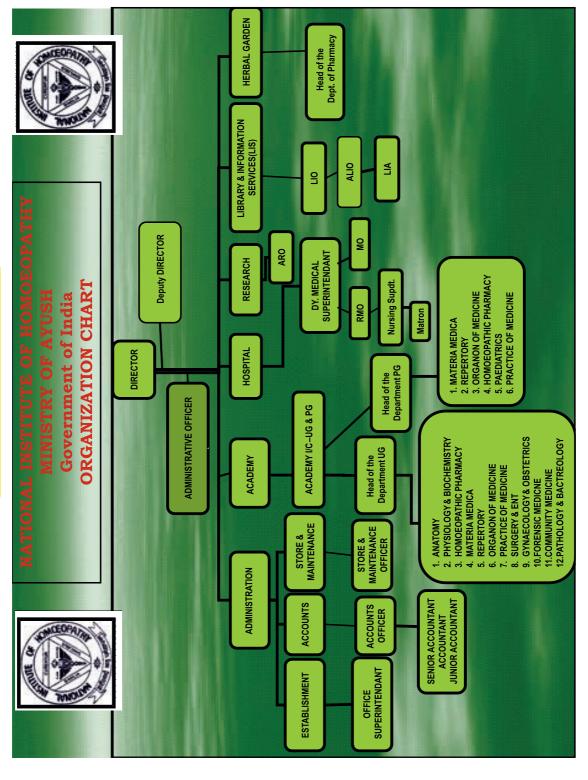

The Institute is recognized by the Central Council of Homoeopathy to conduct BHMS course in Homoeopathy viz., Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery; and from 2004-05 to conduct M.D.(Homoeopathy) courses. It was formerly affiliated to the University of Calcutta and from BHMS 16th Batch (session 2004-05) onwards, the Institute is affiliated to the West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata. During the period total 93-students were admitted in UG course while 36-Nos. of Doctors admitted in PG.

2.1 UNDER GRADUATE COURSE

Bachelor of Homoeopathy Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) course, $5\frac{1}{2}$ years duration (including one year compulsory internship) was started in December 1987. Students possessed Higher Secondary (10 + 2) or equivalent qualification with at least five subjects including English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology were eligible for admission. Presently 28^{th} batch is in role.

For the academic session 2016-17, total 93 seats were available for admission to the BHMS Course, out of which 84 students have taken admission

This year NIH conducted the entrance examination for BHMS course at Kolkata, Chennai, Mumbai, Delhi, Thiruvananthapuram, Hyderabad and Bhopal Centre on 12/06/2016.

2.2 POST GRADUATE COURSE

M.D.(Homoeopathy)course, duration 3 years, was started in the academic year 1998. In this academic year six subjects viz. Organon of Medicine, Materia Medica, Repertory, Homoeopathic Pharmacy, Practice of Medicine and Paediatrics were available. Currently 18th batch has already been enrolled through All India Entrance Examination conducted by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences. The courses are as per the curriculum prescribed by the Central Council of Homoeopathy.

Subject wise distribution of seats in MD (Hom.) course

Out of total 36 students, 2 seats were reserved for sponsored candidates of BIMSTEC countries, joining through Indian Council for Cultural Relation (ICCR).

At present, 18th Batch was taken admission in October 2016, through Post Graduate Homoeopathic Admission Test conducted by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences. 15th Batch of PGTs completed their course curriculum in this academic year. 16th Batch PGTs are preparing their dissertation work.17th Batch PGTs preparing to appear M.D.(Homoeopathy) Part-I Annual Examination 2017.

3. DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

3.1 DEPARTMENT OF ANATOMY

The renovation and extension work of the department of Anatomy is over and the office is been shifted. But the departmental activities such as Dissection – demonstration, classes are being still conducted in the basement of the Auditorium temporarily as repairing work of the mortuary is incomplete.

Sufficient numbers of charts, models, bone sets, skeletons, mounted specimens (viscera's, dissected regions and parts) are available to conduct both lectures as well as demonstration classes for the students. Sufficient numbers of dead bodies (dissected and un-dissected) are preserved in the department. A good number of Histological slides, projection slides, over head project sheets, 3D charts, laminated pictures, CD's, CPR's are available in the department.

Teaching aids like LCD, LCD Monitor, Laptop & Desktop, Over Head Projector, and 35 mm slide Projector, Handy cam, Camera, sufficient number of Microscopes, etc are available in the department. Adequate numbers of text as well as reference books on Anatomy and on other subjects required for day-to-day teaching program are also available in the department. Interactive Pen-Drive is used in conducting lecture & demonstration classes.

Numbers of staff (both teaching and non-teaching) available in the department are not sufficient. Only one full time Professor & one Lecturer, one part time Lecturer, two full time Group- D staff and one part time Group – D staff are available in the department. The post of full time Reader, Technical Assistant and Curator are still vacant. Out of the two Group – D Staff (DOM) one is on leave since long due to health ground for which it is very difficult to carry out the departmental works.

Besides taking classes for the undergraduate and postgraduate students, the faculty members of the department also deliver lectures periodically at Re-Orientation Training program in the subject Anatomy as well as at MCH and CME program as Resource Persons / Experts. The faculty members are also acting as Guide for PGT's [MD (Hom)] students and guiding the Internees for preparation of their Project works and Case Recording as well as attending Seminars and Symposia regularly.

3.2 PHYSIOLOGY & BIO-CHEMISTRY

The Department is located on the 3rd floor of the Academic wing. It has one Physiology Practical class room, one Biochemistry Practical class room, one room for Professor, one room for Reader and one room for lecturer and one room is being used as store. The well-equipped laboratory has been newly renovated to accommodate 50 students at a time to cater the need of increasing number of students at UG level from 2009-10. The departmental library has adequate collection of books required for day-to-day teaching as well as reference work.

The department displayed the **40 nos.** of different display charts, and is having different CDs and animation software's and Pdf format of many books for the academic interest of the students, teachers and visitors, which will give the good impression on their mind.

The Department is staffed with one Reader Dr. A.K.Chowdhury, one Lecturer Dr.Shishir Kumar Singh and supported by one Laboratory Attendant.

Regular and intensive theory and practical classes for First year and Second year students are held. Regular inter-active tutorials also help to enrich the students' knowledge. All the classes, both theory and practical are guided by the C.C.H. regulation and in accordance with the curriculum prescribed by the University.

The syllabus of the Physiology and biochemistry are made into PowerPoint presentation for the students to understand the subject well.

The syllabus of the Physiology and biochemistry are explained through the video also for best understanding of the each physiological phenomenon through clear visual understandings.

The department with sufficient microscopes, Instruments, books, specimens and teaching aids is to be considered as a best Physiology Department among the homoeopathic colleges in India.

Apart from theoretical and practical training in the subject of Physiology periodical assessment tests and tutorials are conducted to equip the students for their 1st BHMS examination under the West Bengal University of Health Sciences.

The efforts are reflected in the result of university examinations.

The faculty members are attending OPD on regular basis and admitting patients in the IPD as well as sharing a number of additional responsibilities. The faculty members also guiding the internees for preparation of their Project work and Case Recording.

H.O.D. Dr. A.K.Chowdhury is holding the additional responsibility of HOD Cardiology and IT Coordinator.

Classes of MD students are also being taken by the full time faculty members.

3.3 ORGANON OF MEDICINE & CHRONIC DISEASES, HOMOEOPATHIC PHILOSOPHY & PSYCHOLOGY

B.H.M.S. classes and M.D. (Hom.) activities were held as per norms of CCH and The West Bengal University of Health Sciences.

In the Post Graduate section there were four batches of students $\{15^{th} \text{ batch} - 8; 16^{th} \text{ batch} - 8; 17^{th} \text{ batch} - 9; 18^{th} \text{ batch} - 8; and two from 12^{th} \text{ batch rejoined} = 35 (Total)\}$. They were undergoing training on clinical classes, group discussion, seminars, tutorial classes, case presentation and journal club, etc.

The department also participate in general seminar, workshop regularly.

An e-library which has **different Seminars**, **lectures by different Stalwarts**, **e-books**, **and e-Journals**, **etc.** was updated. The existing Museum and Archive of History of Medicine was updated.

3.4 MATERIA MEDICA & HOMOEOPATHIC THERAPEUTICS

The department conducts Theoretical, Clinical and Tutorial classes both in Undergraduate and Post Graduate level. The department participates in weekly seminars, clinical and group discussions, workshops organized in the Institution.15th Batch PGTs have successfully completed their M.D.(Hom.) examination. All nine seats are filled in Materia Medica Department of 18th batch PGTs. The students are

taught to be self-relianced under the constant guidance of teachers.

The department organized different lecture programmes, discussions & seminars in which the PG students and the faculty members participated and had discussions.

Almost all the PGTs of this department who have completed their M.D.(Hom.) from NIH, Kolkata are well settled in different positions in the Government jobs either in State Govt. or in Central Govt.

The departmental teachers contributed literary works, delivered lectures as Resource person for different CME programmes conducted by CCRH and different Govt. colleges. One teacher has joined the Ph.D. programme in homoeopathy.

The department imparts teaching to both Under Graduate as well as Post Graduate students.

Under Graduate (UG):-

At present the Case taking and Repertory is taught in 4thB.H.M.S. (Final B.H.M.S.) students with a capacity of 93 students. Theory and Clinical classes are arranged on routine basis for the students of 4th BHMS examination under the West Bengal University of Health Sciences. At present 24th batch students are undergoing the Final B.H.M.S.

After passing final B.H.M.S. examination the students are trained in practical aspect of Repertory for a period of one month during their compulsory rotatory internship.

Post Graduate (PG):-

The department imparts PG course in the subject of Repertory i.e. M.D.(Hom.) with 9 (nine) seats in each academic year. Currently three batches of PG students are pursuing their course namely 16th, 17th and 18th with total no. of 26 students. Departmental activities are conducted on a routine basis on the following topics

- Departmental seminar
- Departmental Case presentation
- Departmental Journal article review

Students of PG department also participate in the general weekly seminar presentation on regular basis maintaining the roster.

Department is equipped with

- PG Departmental Seminar Room with audiovisual facilities.
- Departmental library having 131 nos. of books
- Well equipped computer lab with computes and repertory softwares.
- Class room is equipped with Audio visual aids, charts, etc.

3.6 HOMOEOPATHIC PHARMACY

The department imparts teaching to both UG as well as PG students. They are exposed to different methods of preparing homoeopathic medicines and the method of their standardization as per the standard Pharmacopoeia. Apart from theoretical and practical training in the subject of Pharmacy periodical assessment tests and tutorials are conducted to equip the students for their 1st BHMS examination under the West Bengal University of Health Sciences.

The well-equipped laboratory has been renovated to accommodate 50 students at a time to cater the need of increased number of students at UG level . The laboratory is well decorated with modern pharmaceutical equipment's & apparatuses like distillation plant, hot air oven, water bath, microscope, infrared moisture balance apart from other common instruments. The laboratory also contains 51 herbarium sheets in wooden frame, 146 herb specimen (dry), 36 herb specimens (preserved in FAA solution), 10 mineral specimens and 8 animal specimens and 10 botanical slides.

Department is also having 30 nos. of charts on Pharmacy & also enough chemicals for conducting practical classes. Departmental Library has books in the subjects like BHP, and HPI along with other reference books on medicinal plants and CD's on pharmacy. Department has a small medicinal plants garden in the institute campus. The students of 27th batch was taken to "Dr.Wilmar Schewabe Manufacturing unit at Noida (UP) and HPL Ghaziabad (UP), on 11.07.2016 and 13.07.2016 respectively. The result of the University examination of 26th Batch & supplementary batch BHMS students is being given below.

The department conducts PG course in Homoeopathic Pharmacy i.e., M.D.(Hom.) with three admissions each academic year. There is a separate air conditioned Post Graduate Laboratory where the PG trainees can do their dissertation/research work and practical. This lab has Electric Potentiser, Electric Triturator, Spectroscope, TLC apparatus, Colorimetry apparatus, digital balance, digital pH meter along with glass wares and chemicals. Currently there are four Post Graduate batches in roll (12th, 16th, 17th, and 18th). Three in 2013-16 (15th batch, all passed out in Jan16)), two in 2014-17 (16th batch),three in 2015-18(17th batch) and three PG students got themselves admitted in session 2016-19(17th batch). Two PG students of 12th batch (session 2010-13) rejoined the PG Pharmacy course to complete their study. The 15th batch final Part II exam already held in Dec 2016. They all passed.

3.7 DEPARTMENT OF PRACTICE OF MEDICINE & PAEDIATRICS

The Department is an integrated unit for both undergraduate and postgraduate courses of the affiliating university in the speciality of Practice of Medicine. The subject of Paediatrics at undergraduate level has been and continues to be covered by this Department; while there is a separate Department of Paediatrics solely for postgraduate course.

This Department has functioned with four full-time faculty members – one Professor, one Reader (contractual) and two Lecturers. There are two senior specialist physicians who are attached as Guest Faculty, for assistance in teaching/training of undergraduate/postgraduate students and in ensuring better management of hospital patients. In the later part of the year there were three full-time faculty members.

The Department has been functioning from its new location in the first floor of the New Academic cum Library Building from March 2014.

The intake capacity for MD (Hom) in the subject (of Practice of Medicine) has continued to be three from inception. The first batch (admitted 2009-10), second batch (admitted 2010-11), third batch (admitted 2011-12), fourth batch (admitted 2012-13) and fifth batch (admitted 2013-14) have passed out (Total 13 PG students). The sixth, seventh and eighth batches are currently pursuing their Course (Total 8 PG students).

As in the previous years, the postgraduate students under guidance of faculty members have published several scientific papers in well-known Homoeopathic Journals/Periodicals. The postgraduate students have presented institutional seminars.

In undergraduate curriculum, the faculty takes classes (lectures, tutorials, practicals) during the 2nd, 3rd and 4th BHMS Courses, guides intern projects, and supervises the training for 8 out of 12 months of Internship in accordance with CCH norms. The faculty attends on regular basis patients in OPD and IPD of the hospital of NIH.

Lecturer Dr Subhash Chaudhary participated in the 2nd Multidisciplinary Healthcare Conference AIIMS 2016 held in November in which he presented a scientific paper co-authored by Prof. Dr D Basu, wherein Dr S Chaudhary received the 2nd Prize for "Best Paper Presentation (Homoeopathy)". In this scientific conference [theme "Climbing New Heights: Enriching Public Health through Evidence Based Multidisciplinary Rehabilitation Approaches"], Dr S Chaudhary was bestowed "Significant Contribution Award". Dr S Chaudhary also received, on behalf of National Institute of Homoeopathy, the "Institutional Award". Dr S Chaudhary also attended and presented Scientific Paper in the International Convention on WHD (LHMI) in New Delhi in April 2016 and at the National Homoeopathic Seminar—Homoeo-Youth at Greater Noida 2016.

Lecturer Dr Gautam Pal attended the short term training programme on "Operations Research" in the Indian Institute of Public Health, Gurgaon, under the In-Country Fellowship Programme of WHO.

Professor Dr D Basu was invited to deliver the "Dr Dhanapati Panja Memorial Oration" in the Scientific Conference of Medical College (Kolkata) in January 2017.

Dr Subhash Chaudhary has been the Nodal Officer for National Data Sharing and Accessibility Policy 2012. Dr Gautam Pal has been Associate Editor (Technical) of the Bulletin of NIH. Dr D Basu has been a member of several committees of the affiliating university.

The Department has participated in the School Health Programme of the Institute along with the NIH Hospital under the overall supervision of Professor Dr D Basu. Faculty members and PGTs have participated in Arogya Mela during the year. The faculty interacted with visiting students from Homoeopathic College in Arunachal Pradesh.

3.8 **SURGERY**:

- Activities of the Department: Besides theory and practical classes held for the 3rd and 4th year students as per schedule in IPD, OPD, and Class rooms, students and interns are being acquainted with the basic concepts and techniques in Surgical diseases in the OPD and the IPD.

Students and Interns are being trained in the basics of General Surgery, Orthopaedic Surgery, Eye, ENT and Dental surgery.

Students and interns are being trained in the basics of first aid to a victim/patient in collaboration with St. John Ambulance Association West Bengal.

Dr. Sanjoy Kr. Das, Oncologist, holds special clinic every week for training students and helping the doctors of the Institute involved in cancer related research work.

3.9 OBSTETRICS AND GYNAECOLOGY

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology is involved in teaching of 2nd and 3rd B.H.M.S. students. The department has one full-time lecturer and one guest faculty. The total number of theory classes taken per week is 7 hrs. and clinical classes taken per week are 12 hrs.

There are 6 charts, 14 specimens, 67 instruments, 3 dummy fetus, 2 fetal skulls, 6 contraceptives and 9 models available in the department. Classes of 2nd and 3rd B.H.M.S are conducted as per the norms of C.C.H. and West Bengal University of Health Sciences. Besides the everyday teaching activities the Department also participates in the weekly seminars. Students are being given practical training in the O.P.D., I.P.D. The subject is being taught by making proper integration of knowledge of Homoeopathy. Interns are being guided to carry-out their dissertation work under the guidance of departmental head. P.G.T.s, who have their dissertation on gynecological topics, are being trained and helped to carry out their work. The undersigned is also honored with the W.H.O. Fellowship Training on Adolescent Health in October, 2016.

3.10 DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY MEDICINE

The Department of Community Medicine is involved in teaching of 4th BHMS students as well as research methodology and bio-statistics for PG students. The Department has one museum (for practical demonstration), where different instruments, models and charts related to different subject matters of PSM (e.g. family planning, nutrition, immunization, medical entomology, public health, etc.) is preserved for practical classes. All the classes, both theory and practical, are guided by the CCH regulation and in accordance with the curriculum prescribed by the University.

The students visit different places of public health importance as part of their field visits in accordance with the prescribed university curriculum. The first field visit was to Mother Diary Calcutta, at Dankuni in two groups on 1.04.2016 where the students are exposed to methods of pasteurizations of milk in large scale and production of different milk products such as ghee, curd etc. They were also taken to Indira Gandhi Water Treatment Plant, Palta, Barakpore, on 17.06.2016 and 20.06 2016, where they were exposed on how the water from the river Hooghly is purified and safe drinking water is supplied to the whole city of Kolkata .

Every year from 10th January to 16th January the Homoeopathic Camp at **Gangasagar Mela** is being organized by this Dept. with the help from Hospital Section.

The Interns, 22nd & 23rd batch, were sent to ID Hospital as well as to Bidhannagar Subdivisional Hospital for two weeks training in management of infectious diseases and for exposure to various National Health Programmes that were being carried out through Primary health centre respectively on monthly rotation basis.

3.11 FORENSIC MEDICINE & TOXICOLOGY

The Dept. of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology is headed by a full-time Professor assisted by a full time Reader. Regular theoretical, practical and tutorial classes for 2nd BHMS students are taken by the faculties. The teachers of the department are also involved in patient care and training of interns as well as PGTs' in the hospital OPD and IPD.

At present in the current batch 105 students are attending classes. In the previous batch 54 students appeared for university examination last year, out of which 53 students passed the university examination successfully and the unsuccessful student will be appearing with the current batch of students. Undergraduate students of 2nd BHMS course are imparted with up-to-date knowledge in Forensic Medicine and Toxicology in compliance with the CCH guidelines. Like previous years, students were taken to R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital Morgue, Kolkata for demonstration of medicolegal autopsies [postmortems]. They had to appear for theoretical, practical and oral class assessment examinations which had immensely helped them to groom themselves for the university examinations.

The well-equipped Museum-cum-demonstration room of the department can accommodate 35 students at a time and has 30 wax models, 04 sets of dried non- articulated human bone specimens of both sexes, 25 wet specimens (different types of snakes), 136 various types of weapons, 110 poisonous specimens, 14 charts, 25 different instruments and appliances along with 150 photographs, 02 CDs and a good number of radiological plates (exposed X-ray films)---all of medico-legal importance for demonstration purpose to the students.

3.12 PATHOLOGY & MICROBIOLOGY

3. Activities in this Department:

- 1) The Department of Pathology and Microbiology of National Institute of Homoeopathy is well-arranged Department for the IIND B.H.M.S. students under W.B.U.H.S.
- 2) The Department of Pathology and Microbiology were upgrading the Department by <u>Inducting Microbiology Laboratory</u> in Room no: 226 by the Director of NIH which improve the standard of institution are of National importance.
- 3) There are 200 hrs. Lecture classes & 142hrs. Practical classes (up to 31/03/17) in 26th batch and 46 hrs. Lecture classes & 32hrs. Practical classes (up to 31/03/17) with good facilities for practicing independently by using individual microscope under table lamp which is more beneficial for the each student even in cloudy & rainy weather.
- 4) The **108 students of 26th batch** are attended the regular class and **46 students of 27th batch** attended the classes separately.
- 5) For the departmental Library, requisition is submitted to the Central library for new books. **43 No of books** in Pathology and Homoeopathic books those were in both Departmental Library books as well as personal books of Dr.Kumaravel.V.
- 6) The Pathology museum consisting of **56 nos.** of malignant specimens for the students and different visitors from the different colleges in India and abroad.
- 7) The department displayed the **17 nos.** of different display charts for the academic interest of the student, teachers and visitors, which will give the good impression on their mind.
- 8) The bacteriological experiments like culture media, Hanging drop preparation and certain serological experiments are the curricular activities of student's practical learning.

- 9) The department has one LED Monitor & one LAPTOP which help the students to learn more pathogenesis with morphological characteristic by visual image & animations.
- 10) The syllabus of the pathology µbiology are made into PowerPoint presentation as well as video presentations for the students to understand the subject well.
- 11) The syllabus of the pathology & microbiology are explained through the video for best understanding of the each diseases aspect through clear visual understandings.
- 12) The practical demonstration of macroscopic & microscopic characteristics of all topics through the software known as dewinter capture pro 4.1 to the student for their excellence.
- 13) **96.3% Candidates** have passed in final University Examination in the session of 2015–2016 (25th Batch)

The <u>upgraded Department</u> with sufficient microscope, books, specimens, Laboratory and teaching aids is to be considered as a **Best PATHOLOGY AND MICROBIOLOGY DEPARTMENT** among the Homoeopathic colleges in India.

3.13 DEPARTMENT OF PAEDIATRICS (PG)

The department is functioning as a separate department as per the regulations of CCH, New Delhi since 2009 when the MD (Hom) course in the subject Paediatrics is introduced here at NIH. Presently the department is shifted to the new Academic Block in the specified area where there are separate Lecture Hall, Departmental Library, Laboratory, Rooms for Head / In-charge and Teaching Faculty as well as PGT's. Audio-visual facilities are available in the Lecture Hall and the Laboratory.

The intake capacity for MD (Hom) in the subject is three (03) student per session. Two part-time Guest Lecturers are available in the department. One full time professor is looking after the department as in-charge (Additional charge) of the department and coordinating the activities of the department.

The department is well equipped as per regulations of CCH, New Delhi. There is one dedicated Pediatric O.P.D. attached to the Hospital. Six Beds are available in the I.P.D. where Patients are admitted regularly from Pediatric O.P.D. Regular Journal Club, Clinical case discussion, weekly departmental Seminar and monthly general seminars are conducted by the department of Paediatrics.

3.14 LIBRARY & INFORMATION SERVICES

The NIH Library and Information Services Division was established with the inception of the Institute in the year 1978. This is regarded as one of the best libraries in India in the field of Homoeopathy. The library and Information Services (LIS)Division aims to develop a comprehensive collection of documents that is useful for the physicians, research scholars and staff of NIH in their R & D and clinical activities of the Institute and disseminates information to all the users of LIC.

Presently the Library and Information Services Division shifted from old central library and occupies 3rd floor of the **New Academic cum Library Building** situated at the north-east centre of the main campus of the Institute. The floor area of the Department of Library & Information Services is more than square ft/meters.







Objectives:

- The main objective of the Library & Information Services is to organize and to make the documents available to the users.
- To develop NIH Library & Information Centre, Kolkata into National Information Centre on Homoeopathy.

Activities' of the library

The Library & Information Services division provides the information system which is taken care of by efficient library staff. At present, there are more than 22000 books and 15 subscribed journals in the library. Institute has its own website, http://www.nih.nic.in developed in the year 2002. Current Awareness Services (CAS) and Flash (Internet information on homoeopathy world) are provided and partial automation has been achieved through **WINISIS** software. One archive for rare books, including some rare non-English (German, Spanish etc.) books, is available as reference books.

Selective Dissemination (SDI) service, a bi-monthly compilation of the contents of the current journals, subscribed by the Institute is published regularly. Reprography, binding, photography, A/V etc., are also provided. Five PG Departmental Libraries were set up with the help of the Central Library & Information Service Department. Presently all the UG departments also have Departmental Library.

4. MEDICAL SERVICES

INTRODUCTION

National Institute of Homoeopathy, an autonomous Institution under Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India is having 100 bedded hospital for imparting teaching Homoeopathy to post graduate and under graduate students.

The Hospital is consisting of Out Patient and In-patient departments providing medical services at a registration fee of Rs. 5.00 per patient & nominal charges for investigations have been imposed from the year 2011 onwards. The outpatient department functioning from 9.00 a.m. till the last patient is served. Apart from general medicine, some specialized clinics are also in service. A large number of different types of patients from far flung areas seek treatment through Homoeopathic systems of medicine. The hospital has investigation facilities viz. Clinical Pathology, Biochemistry, Radiology, Ultra-Sonography, Lung Function Test and ECG etc. The Institute has been presently providing Indoor facilities through 100 bedded hospitals of which 08 beds are earmarked for Surgery, 06 for Paediatrics and 04 for Maternity. As this is an Academic Institution, patients suffering from different ailment are admitted for treatment as well as for clinical training of the Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate students. Considering the increasing demand of Homoeopathic treatment, the Ministry of AYUSH, approved the construction of Hospital extension building G+3 at the site adjacent to existing hospital building which is ongoing and likely to be completed in a short period. The bed strength of the Hospital will then be enhanced to 250 beds in a phase wise manner. This report shall discuss hospital services provided under following heads-

4.1 **OUT PATIENT DEPARTMENT (OPD)**

The National Institute of Homoeopathy Hospital (NIH) is rendering valuable health care services in Homoeopathy to the needy patients from areas far and around. Over the years there is increase in service load due to increase in number of patients attending OPD daily at NIH. The Out-patients and Inpatients Departments of the Institute provide medical care to the patients suffering from different ailments. Three lakh thirty four thousand five hundred and sixty seven (334567) patients visited the NIH OPD during the FY 2016-2017 out of which 329903 patients were attended OPD at NIH, Salt Lake Complex, Kolkata and 4664 patients were attended at POPD, Kalyani, Dist.-Nadia, W.B.

PERIPHERAL OPD (POPD)

A peripheral OPD is functioning once in a week at NIH Herbal Garden Complex, Kalyani, Dist.-Nadia, about 60 Km. away from NIH, Salt Lake Complex. The physicians, PGTs and internees are regularly attending this OPD. The medicines are dispensed to the patients at free of costs. During the FY 2016-2017, 4664 (four thousand six hundred and sixty four) patients were provided treatment there. The monthly average patient turnout was 389 as compared to 274 in the previous year, showing an increase of 10.58% in patient in this year.

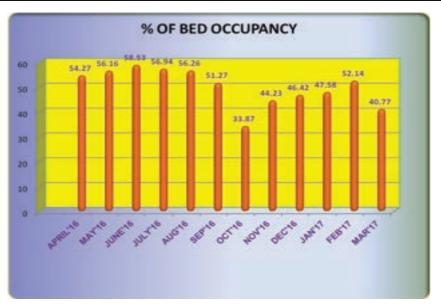

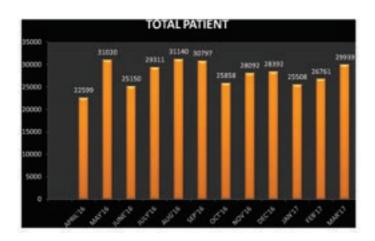

HOSPITAL RECORD KEEPING

A systematic data entry and record-keeping of all IPD patients has been initiated and records from 2008-09 to 2016-17 are completed and entered in the database. This is a step forward in the direction of Medical records Division of NIH, envisioned for the future when new hospital building is completed.

HOSPITAL KITCHEN & DIET

At present raw materials are procured from suppliers and prescribed diet for the admitted patients are prepared by our own staff in the In-House-Kitchen of the Institute. The dietitian looks into special requirements or recommendations for the diet of the patients. The hospital kitchen has been modernized to serve for 250 bedded hospital patients after expansion program is being done.

DISPENSARY

The prescribed medicine of the IPD & OPD patients are dispensed from the In-House Dispensary of the hospital. Emphasis is given to dispense quality medicines to the patients at free of cost. Necessary care has been taken so that every patient is being dispensed accurately the prescribed medicine. Adequate stock of medicine is maintained as per the approved Formulary Committee of the Institute.

AMBULANCE SERVICE

The hospital also provides Ambulance Service for transportation of the patients when required in emergency. Ambulance is available round the clock for which driver's accommodation inside the campus for service as and when required is arranged.

4.3 OPERATION THEATRE

The Hospital is having well equipped, two modern Operation Theatres with apparatus/instruments, such as pulse-ox meter, diathermy, portable ECG and X-ray etc. Operation techniques are demonstrated to the students for training. The Institute has a labour room and provides antenatal and post-natal care to the mother and child.

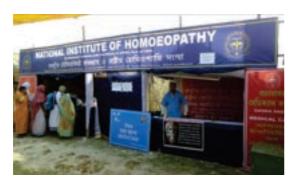

4.9 MEDICINAL HERB GARDEN

The herb garden at Kalyani, about 50 km away from Kolkata, was envisaged for building up of repository of authentic specimens of living herbs for research and academic purposes and acclimatization of exotic herbs in the fertile plains of gangetic alluvium in West Bengal, in order to develop import substitutes, for catering to the needs of local pharmaceutical industries as well as export

oriented products. The garden, spread over about 25 acres of land has grown and maintained 100 different species of medicinal plants, including 10 exotic species. Steps have been taken to develop the infrastructure.

1.5 Kilometer of road network in the garden have been developed with excavated earth from the existing water body in the garden and sprinkler irrigation system for 8 acres of land has been developed.

Medicinal crop Alfalfa has registered a good yield.

Among the medicinal species Piper nigrum, Gymnemasylvestris, Menthaarvensis and sugar substitute Stevia rebaudiana have been introduced in the garden.

Medicinal crops Linumusitatissimum & Cuminumcyminum registered good yield demonstrating that wide range of commercial crops can be grown successfully at the garden.

The proposal already been taken by the N.I.H authority to cultivate, nurturing and utilizing some medicinal herbs in relation to manufacturing mother tincture for institute's own use and marketing. For this purpose one horticulturist will be appointed very soon.

For beautification of herbal garden one small flower garden adjacent of main entrance is well maintained. One peripheral OPD is running once in a week (Friday) in this Herb garden premises, more than 100 patients are attending for homeopathy treatment.

A project proposal has been prepared after consultation with Bdhan Chandra Krishi Viswavidyalay and submitted to the Director, NIH for approval.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of the National Institute of Homoeopathy, Kolkata for the year ended 31 March 2017

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the National Institute of Homoeopathy, Kolkata as at 31 March 2017, the Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section-20(1) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Power and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The audit has been entrusted for the period upto 2017-18. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection R'eports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- ii. The Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format prescribed by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Institute as required in so far as it appears from our examination of books.
- iv. We further report that

Comments on Accounts:

- A. Balance Sheet
- 1.1 Assets
- 1.1.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule-8) ₹ 45.14 crore
- (i) The above head was understated by ₹ 4.61 lakh as the Library Books (₹ 4.17 lakh), Furniture & Fixture (₹ 0.19 lakh) and Laboratory Equipments (₹ 0.25 lakh) were not booked in Accounts though those were acquired during the year 2016-17. Even no Provision for liability in respect of the above mentioned assets were made during the year 2016-17. This further resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities and Provision by ₹ 4.61 lakh.
- (ii) The above head was understated by an amount of ₹2706.49 lakh as the advances paid to NPCCL and CPWD (including current year's advance amount of ₹389.06 lakh) had not been shown as adjusted although the whole construction works (Academic cum Library Building (₹2653.16 lakh), Hospital Extension Building (₹50.00 lakh) and Pathway to New Academic Building (₹3.33 lakh) had been completed at the end of September 2016. Due to non-inclusion of the completed works of Academic cum Library Building, Hospital Extension Building and Pathway to New Academic Building with the main head of Building, Fixed Assets remained understated. The Institute had kept the value of construction works under Works-in-Progress (₹999.61 lakh) and as

advance of ₹1706.88 lakh. Non-inclusion of completed works with the value of Fixed Assets (Building) resulted in overstatement of Current Assets. Loans and Advances by ₹1706.88 lakh and Works-in-Progress by ₹999.61 lakh.

B. Income & Expenditure Accounts

2.1 Expenditure

2.1.1 Depreciation (Sch-8): ₹ 403.33 lakh

The above head was understated by ₹271.96 lakh due to the following:

- (i) Non-charging of depreciation of ₹ 1.31 lakh (₹ 1.25 lakh on Library Book (₹ 4.17*60%/2), ₹ 0.01 lakh on Furniture & Fixture (₹ 0.19*10%/2) and ₹ 0.05 lakh on Laboratory Equipments (₹ 0.25*40%/2) on the Fixed Assets worth ₹ 4.61 lakh (Library Books ₹ 4.17 lakh, Furniture & Fixture ₹ 0.19 lakh and Laboratory Equipments ₹ 0.25 lakh) acquired during the year but not included with Fixed Assets.
- (ii) Non-charging of depreciation of ₹270.65 lakh on the completed and put to use of the works of Buildings worth ₹2706.49 lakh.

This further resulted in overstatement of Excess of Income over Expenditure by ₹ 271.96 lakh.

2.2 Income

2.2.1 Fees/ Subscription (Schedule-14) ₹ 149.08 lakh

The above head was overstated by ₹ 15.20 lakh as the amount of Caution Money collected along with the Admission Fee was exhibited as Receipt/Income of the Institute. Since Caution Money is refundable to the students, the amount of Caution Money should have been booked under the head Current Liabilities and Provision instead of showing the amount as Receipt/Income of the Institute. This had further resulted in overstatement of Excess of Income over Expenditure by ₹ 15.20 lakh.

C. Provident Fund Account

3.1 Corpus/Capital Fund - GPF

The above head was understated by ₹27.76 lakh due to transfer of ₹37.54 lakh instead of transfer of ₹9.78 lakh from the Corpus Fund (GPF) to the Member Fund. This excess transfer (₹27.76 lakh) had further resulted in overstatement of Member Fund by ₹27.76 lakh.

3.2 GPF-Current Assets: Accrued Interest-₹ 62.43 lakh

The above head was overstated by ₹ 27.16 lakh due to non-deduction of accrued interest on receipt of matured Fixed Deposits of ₹ 605.81 lakh. The Institute had also not deducted receipt of accrued interest of ₹ 0.18 lakh (₹ 0.17 lakh on matured FED No.33210 and ₹ 0.01 lakh on matured FED No.33292). Non-deduction of accrued interest had resulted in overstatement of both Current Assets and Capital Fund by ₹ 27.34 lakh at the end of 2016-17.

3.3 The amount on Term Deposit under Cash at bank in the balance sheet of GP Fund account was exhibited as ₹568.74 lakh. But the Investment certificate in respect of Term deposits had shown the amount of ₹605.51 lakh. Thus there was a discrepancy of ₹36.77 lakh which needs to be reconciled.

3.4 Contributory Provident Fund

- i) Accrued Interest on Term Deposit of Contributory Provident Fund (C.P.Fund) was exhibited as ₹ 2.45 lakh in the Balance Sheet of C P Fund. But in the Interest certificate of C P Fund the amount was shown as ₹ 1.69 lakh. Thus there was a discrepancy of ₹ 0.76 lakh which needs to be reconciled.
- ii) The amount on Term Deposit under Cash at bank in the Balance Sheet of C P Fund account was exhibited as ₹32.18 lakh. But the Investment certificates of term deposit of C P Fund had shown the amount of ₹32.55 lakh. Thus there was a discrepancy of ₹0.37 lakh which needs to be reconciled.

3.5 Receipts and Payments of Pension Fund exhibited receipt of fund of ₹ 186.00 lakh from General Fund Account where as no such payment was exhibited in the Receipts and Payments Account of General Fund. The discrepancy needs to be settled.

D General

4.1 The Institute in its 'Significant Accounting Policies' (Schedule-24) appended with Main Balance Sheet disclosed that retirement benefits of the employees have been accounted for on cash basis. However, as per instructions of the Common Format of Accounts, the retirement benefits needs to be reflected on actuarial basis. Despite mention in previous years' Audit Report, the Institute had not taken any corrective action to this effect.

E Grants-in-Aid:

The Institute is financed by the grants from the Government of India. During the year 2016-17, the institute had received total grants of ₹ 3517.00 lakh (Plan ₹ 3167.00 and Non- Plan ₹ 350.00 lakh). Out of the total grant received, the Institute had utilized ₹ 2627.66 lakh (Plan ₹ 2375.75 lakh and Non Plan ₹ 251.91 lakh) resulting in net unspent balance of ₹ 889.34 lakh (Plan ₹ 791.25 lakh and Non Plan ₹ 98.09 lakh).

F Net Effect:

Net impact of the comments given in the preceding paragraphs is that both the Assets and Liabilities were understated by ₹ 4.61 lakh as at 31 March 2017 and Excess of Income over Expenditure was overstated by ₹ 287.16 lakh for the year ended 31 March 2017; and, the Assets and Liabilities of the General Provident Fund were overstated by ₹ 27.34 lakh for the year ended 31 March 2017.

G Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Director, National Institute of Homeopathy, Kolkata through a Management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements, read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in the Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India
 - a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the National Institute of Homoeopathy, Kolkata, as at 31 March 2017 and
 - b. In so far as it relates to Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

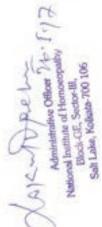

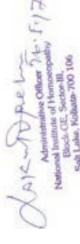

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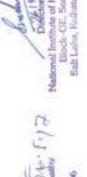

SCHEDULE 24 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Principal activities of the Institute are to impart education, provide health care facilities and promoting research activities in Homoeopathy.

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

- (i) The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting.
- (ii) Government Grants, against which sanction orders are issued within 31st March are taken into account as income for that financial year, on accrual basis.
- (iii) The Institute's accounts reflect the utilisation of the grants received/receivable from the Government of India and other related incomes received/accrued up to 31st March. Therefore, liabilities, though known and admissible, are provided for in the accounts of respective year only to the extent of fund available.
- (iv) All other known incomes, if accrued within 31st March, whether received or not, are taken into account on accrual basis.
- (v) Liabilities for expenses over Rs.1000/- to the extent known, up to a cut-off date 31st May, 2017 and admissible are accounted for. Similarly, payments in advance for subsequent accounting period are accounted for as advance/pre-paid expenses.

2. FIXED ASSETS

For any expenditure incurred for creation of Capital Asset utilizing Grant received for the purpose and for purchase of other assets the Corpus/Capital Fund Account is credited by capitalizing from the Earmarked Fund for Capital Grant and General Plan Grants received (the balance available plan grant is utilized for revenue expenditure). When the Assets are sold/condemned or otherwise disposed off, the respective asset account is credited by the written down book value of the asset and the difference between written down value and net realized value is exhibited as profit/loss on disposal of obsolete assets and credited/debited to income and expenditure account respectively.

Assets are shown at gross value less accumulated depreciation provided in the accounts upto the end of the year.

3. DEPRECIATION AND AMORTISATION OF LEASEHOLD LAND

Depreciation on assets has been calculated on the provisional method on the written down value of the assets at the prevailing rates of depreciation specified in the Income Tax Act, 1961 as amended from time to time. The depreciation has been provided in the books on additions to the assets and put to use during the year for a period of less than 180 days in the financial year is provided at 50% of the prescribed rates. The total depreciation calculated on all depreciable assets during the year, is provided for by charging the Income and Expenditure Account and for the depreciation accumulated upto 2014-15 not provided for in the books as per audit has been debited to Prior Period Adjustment Account. An amount equal to the amount of depreciation provided on assets created out of Government Grant has been withdrawn from Capital / Corpus Fund and credited to Income & Expenditure Account as per the provisions of Accounting Standard - 12.

4. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted in INR (Indian Rupee) at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction. No expenditure in foreign currency has been incurred by the Institute during the current and previous year.

5. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

No liability towards gratuity payable on death / retirement / termination of employees including leave encashment benefit is provided on actuarial basis in the accounts. All such retirement benefits are recorded on the basis of actual payment.

6. SET OFF

Advances to staff and third parties are set off against the corresponding liabilities by charging the relevant expenditure, to the extent linked.

7. INVESTMENT

The Institute has no Investment other than Term Deposits in the Nationalised Banks. As per Memorandum of Association, Rules and Regulations and Bye Laws of the Institute, the Institute's entire investment are made with Nationalised Bank in Short Term Bank deposits.

8. INVENTORY VALUATION

Medicines and consumables purchased by the Institute has duly been recorded and maintained by dispensary and store. Quantitative details are available with respective department. The value of stock as at the year end has not been incorporated in the books.
